Scorecard

**A** AI has compiled this Scorecard for the 107th Congress to inform Arab Americans of the voting record of their members of Congress. The Scorecard is based on congressional actions on a number of issues of concern to Arab Americans in the areas of foreign and domestic policy.

Since very few of these issues actually come to a vote, we have based our evaluation on a variety of actions taken by members of Congress, including votes on legislation, sponsorship of legislation not voted upon, resolutions, and endorsement of “dear colleague” letters.

While not comprehensive, and while no member of Congress can be judged fairly by any single action, this guide provides a general profile of congressional behavior that we hope will help Arab Americans better understand congressional attitudes towards these key issues.

# The Issues

---

## Senate

**1) Relations with Palestinian Leadership:** The bills for rating this category are S 2194, the “Arafat Accountability Act,” which calls for cutting ties with Arafat and the Palestinian Authority; S CON RES 88, a one-sided bill that expresses solidarity with Israel in the fight against terrorism while ignoring the Palestinian humanitarian crisis and the impact of Israel's occupation; and S RES 247, a similar one-sided bill supportive of Israel. There have also been several letters calling for the Administration to restrict relations with Chairman Arafat. A (+) in this category indicates that the Senator was generally moderate on the Palestinian-Israeli conflict. A (-) assumes that the senator voted for S RES 247 and generally supported unbalanced actions on ties with the Palestinian leadership.

**2) Syria and Iraq:** Critical Middle East legislation in the Senate includes S 2215, the “Syria Accountability Act,” sponsored by Senators Boxer (D-CA) and Santorum (R-PA). It aims to cut ties with the Syrian government unless the president affirms that Syria has met certain criteria in support of anti-terrorism efforts. Senators received a (-) if they co-sponsored this legislation, or if they sent a letter or made a statement in support of taking military action against Iraq.

**3) Immigration:** Among more positive initiatives in the Senate are bills like S 2449, sponsored by Senator Bingaman (D-NM), which allows federal payments to be made for pregnancy-related services and testing and treatment of communicable diseases to aliens who are not lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States. Also, S 2493, sponsored by Senator Daschle (D-SD), provides the 245 (I) extension, allowing one to remain in the country when reapplying for a visa. Senators signing onto these or similar bills designed to uphold the rights and pro-

vide services for immigrants received a (+). A (-) indicates that the senator has advocated restricting immigration or services to immigrants.

**4) Hate Crimes:** S 625, the “Local Law Enforcement Enhancement Act of 2001,” sponsored by Senator Ted Kennedy (D-MA), provides federal assistance to states and local jurisdictions to prosecute hate crimes. It prohibits specified offenses involving actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability. Those co-sponsoring the bill or making statements against hate crimes receive a (+).

**5) Civil Liberties:** The passage of the USA PATRIOT Act gives law enforcement additional powers to prevent terrorism, some of which, it is believed, erode our civil liberties – particularly in the Arab American community. Those who received a (+) in this category have made statements supporting the protection of civil liberties, questioned or opposed the USA PATRIOT Act, or co-sponsored S 989, the “End Racial Profiling Act of 2001” offered by Senator Russ Feingold (D-WI). S 989 prohibits law enforcement from engaging in racial profiling by establishing grants for training and maintaining adequate policies designed to eliminate racial profiling.

**6) Special category:** Senators receive a positive rating for:

- Statements against discrimination based on race, ethnicity, religion, or national origin
- Balanced statements on Israel/Palestine policy, even if they voted for one-sided resolutions

Negative ratings were given to senators who were consistently against issues important to Arab Americans or who made one-sided pro-Israel statements.

## House

**1) Anti-Palestinian Legislation/Solidarity with Israel:** Pro-Israeli interests groups were successful in passing several unbalanced bills and resolutions. H Res 392, the “Solidarity with Israel” resolution sponsored by Rep. Tom DeLay (R-TX), made no mention of the continuing occupation of Palestinian land nor the humanitarian crisis facing the Palestinians. Those who voted for this resolution received a (-). Those who voted against the bill or “present” on the bill received a (+). Those not voting are left blank.

**2) US Aid to Lebanon:** Nineteen representatives wrote a letter to Foreign Operations Subcommittee Chair Jim Kolbe (R-AZ) expressing support for continued economic assistance to Lebanon, set at \$35 million. Those signing on to this letter received a (+).

**3) Iraq:** This category includes those calling for the overthrow of Saddam Hussein in Iraq, and those who favor a more “moderate” policy ranging from returning inspectors

to Iraq to Congressional review of any efforts to invade Iraq. Representatives who want to “go slow” on Iraq get a (+). Those receiving a (-) have announced they favor military action against Iraq.

**4) Syria Accountability:** The Syria Accountability Act, sponsored by Rep. Armeiy (R-TX) and Rep. Engel (D-NY), would further isolate America from strengthening relations with Syria. Their bill (HR 4483) places sanctions on Syria unless the president determines it has met certain criteria aimed at curbing support of terrorism. Those co-sponsoring the measure, currently 134, received a (-).

**5) Balanced Resolutions:** There are House members who have worked hard to promote a balanced US policy in the Middle East by introducing legislation or resolutions that support US engagement as an honest broker. Those members who support these resolutions or who have made statements favoring a balanced Middle East policy are indicated with a

(+); actions include:

**H RES 374:** Supports US-backed UN Resolution 1397 calling for an immediate cessation of the violence in the Middle East and a resumption of negotiations to end the conflict in the region. Sponsors: Darrell Issa (R-CA), John Dingell (D-MI).

**H RES 205:** Suggests international peacekeepers as a means to re-established conditions for negotiations and end the cycle of violence in the Palestinian-Israeli conflict. Sponsored by John Dingell (D-MI)

**H RES 394:** Reinforces the need for a political solution to the Palestinian-Israeli conflict and expresses grave concern about the continuing escalation in violence between Israel and the Palestinians. Sponsored by Peter DeFazio (D-OR).

**H CON RES 253:** Endorses the recommendations of the Mitchell Commission Report and the need to end the violence between Palestinians and Israelis. Sponsored by John Dingell (D-MI).

**6) Immigration:** Opponents of liberal immigration policies are using the war on terrorism to advocate more restrictive immigration. For this rating, legislation, letters and statements that deal with the immigration issues were included. Those supporting more liberal immigration policies received a (+). Those who support legislation or have expressed interest in restricting immigration received a (-). Actions include:

**HR 2712:** Mass Immigration Reduction Act of 2001 effectively puts a moratorium on immigration. Sponsored by Thomas Tancredo (R-CO).

**HR 3894:** The Restoration of Fairness in Immigration Act of 2002 restores many of the social services denied immigrants under the 1996 revisions.

**HR 1452:** Family Reunification Act of 2001. Amends the Immigration and Nationality Act to permit certain long-term permanent resident aliens to be able to avoid deportation under certain conditions. Sponsored by Rep. Barney Frank (D-MA).

**7) Anti-Bigotry, Violence and discrimination against Arab Americans:** Following September 11, Arab Americans received broad support in Congress from members who spoke out against backlash against Arab Americans. H CON RES 227, introduced by Rep. David Bonior (D-MI) and cosponsored by 116 members, condemned bigotry and violence against Arab Americans, American Muslims, and Americans from South Asia. They received a (+).

**8) Racial Profiling:** Rep. John Conyers (D-MI) introduced HR 2074, the "End Racial Profiling Act of 2001" that seeks to eliminate the use of racial profiling by prohibiting law enforcement agencies from using racial profiling and by establishing grants for training and maintaining policies designed to eliminate racial profiling. Those cosponsoring the bill or generally making statements against racial profiling receive a (+).

**9) Hate Crimes:** Rep. John Conyers (D-MI) introduced HR 1343, the "Local Law Enforcement Hate Crimes Prevention Act of 2001" that provides federal assistance to states and local jurisdictions to prosecute hate crimes. It prohibits specified offenses involving actual or perceived race, color, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability. Those cosponsoring the bill or making statements against hate crimes receive a (+).

**10) USA PATRIOT Act:** The USA PATRIOT Act, an acronym for "Uniting and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism," was passed by Congress following the 9/11 attacks. It has many controversial sections and grants the government new powers to investigate and detain. For example, it includes a provision granting the Secretary of State the power to designate any foreign or domestic group as a terrorist organization, and this authority is not subject to review. Those who voted for the Act received a (-). Those who voted against the bill, in support of protecting civil liberties, received a (+).

**11) Special Category:** Members receive a (+) or a (-) – or in several cases, both – for special individual initiatives in support of or in opposition to Arab American concerns. These include civil rights, Middle East relations and several letters including:

- Rep. Henry Waxman (D-CA) and Ileana Ros-Lehtinen (R-FL): One-sided condemnation of Palestinian terrorism
- Rep. Elliot Engel (D-NY) and Rep. Ben Gilman (R-NY): US should reexamine its relationship with Saudi Arabia based on their actions against our interests
- Rep. Tom Lantos (D-CA): Calls for an investigation of UNWRA for possible assistance to terrorists
- Reps. Peter Deutsch (D-FL), Jack Kingston (R-GA), Gene Green (D-TX), and Ros-Lehtinen (R-FL): One-sided condemnation of Arafat and his support for terrorism
