The Arab American Institute has compiled this Scorecard for the 109th Congress to inform our community of their members' voting records. The Scorecard is based on Congressional actions on a number of issues, outlined below.

Though not comprehensive, and though no member of Congress can be judged fairly by any single action, this guide provides a general profile of Congressional behavior that we hope will help Arab Americans better understand actions taken on these key issues.

While it's vital that you cast your vote on Election Day, it's just as important that you stay involved throughout the year, by taking action when an issue before Congress or your local legislature affects you. Here are some ways you can take action:

Online

Visit the AAI website (www.aaiusa.org), where you'll find frequently updated information on issues of interest to the Arab American community.

You can contact your Senators and Representative on the **Action Alerts** portion of our website: just select the issue you're concerned about and enter your zip code to get started.

You'll be prompted to select which of your representatives you'd like to write to and to fill out your name and contact information. We include sample letters and issue briefs to assist you. It's a quick, easy and effective way to get your message across.

You can also visit your Senators' or Representative's websites (find them at www.house.gov or www.senate.gov) and send them an email.

Letters

If you'd like to write a personalized letter, keep the following tips in mind:

- Keep the letter concise, polite and to the point
- Note the name and number of a particular piece of legislation in the letter
- Follow up with a phone call a week or two after sending your letter

Phone Calls

Phone calls are one of the most common, and easiest, means of communicating with your member's office. Keep in mind:

- Ask to speak to the relevant legislative assistant or, in the case of district offices, caseworker.
- Always be polite when expressing your views.
- Follow up with a letter stating your concerns.

Personal Visits

Personal visits, either in your home state or in Washington, are the most effective means of communicating with your congressional members. 1. Palestinian Aid: The results of the Palestinian legislative elections led to several bills aimed at placing further restrictions on U.S. aid to the Palestinian people. Although S. 2370 was more reasonable than the House legislation (HR 4681), AAI continued to have concerns with the bill's overall tone and several of its provisions. While the bill passed by unanimous consent on June 23, the nine senators who chose not to cosponsor received a (+). On May 1, Senator **John E. Sununu** (R-NH) and six other senators sent a letter to the Senate Appropriations Committee supporting the Middle East People-to-People Coexistence Program, which supports Palestinian and Israeli NGOs on projects including educational programs, business cooperation, health care initiatives and inter-religious dialogue. Signatories received a (+). Two pieces of legislation (S. 2237 and S.Con. Res. 79) sought to add further limits on U.S. aid to the Palestinian Authority (PA), even though current law already requires a presidential waiver for any transfer of U.S. funds directly to the PA. Cosponsors of either bill received a (-).

2. Lebanon Resolution: S. Res. 534 was sponsored by Senate Majority Leader **Bill Frist** (R-TN) and introduced just six days after the war in Lebanon began. The uneven resolution did not include a call for a ceasefire, urged the President to “fully support” Israel's actions and did not include any support for Lebanon's democratically elected government. The bill passed by unanimous consent. Senators who did not cosponsor received a (+); Cosponsors received a (-).

3. Lebanon (Other): Several senators deserve special recognition for their strong support for Lebanon.

- After receiving a letter signed by over 100 constituents of Lebanese descent, Senator **Christopher Dodd** (D-CT) introduced S. Res 548 on August 3, which passed by unanimous consent. Unlike S. Res 534, this resolution included calls for a cessation of hostilities, an international donor's conference to rebuild Lebanon's infrastructure, U.S. engagement to promote peace and support for Lebanon's sovereignty and independence. Cosponsors received a (+).

- On July 26, Senator **John E. Sununu** (R-NH) and five other senators sent a letter to Lebanese Prime Minister Fouad Siniora pledging support for the Lebanese people. Signatories received a (+).

- On July 31, Senator **Richard Durbin** (D-IL) introduced S.Res. 548, a resolution to grant “temporary protected status” to Lebanese nationals in the U.S. because of the war in Lebanon. Cosponsors received a (+).

- On September 6, the Senate rejected an amendment to the Defense Appropriations Bill (S. 5631) offered by Senators **Dianne Feinstein** (D-CA) and **Patrick Leahy** (D-VT) calling for the protection of “civilian lives from unexploded cluster munitions” by

preventing U.S. tax dollars from being spent to acquire, utilize, sell or transfer cluster munitions. The final vote was 30 in favor, 70 opposed. Senators who voted in favor received a (+).

4. Immigration: After over a year of debate, on May 25, the Senate voted on May 25 the “Comprehensive Immigration Reform Act of 2006” (S. 2611), sponsored by Senator **Arlen Specter** (R-PA). S. 2611 was a compromise bill that included a temporary worker program, family unification provisions, as well as the DREAM Act, a bill to provide a path to citizenship for undocumented minors. The bill included concerns about due-process, while the vote acknowledged the need for a comprehensive and workable fix for our broken immigration system. The bill passed by a vote of 62-36. Senators who voted in favor received a (+); those who opposed received a (-). On September 29, the Senate voted on H.R. 6061, an enforcement-only bill to build a 700-mile fence along the U.S.-Mexico border without providing for the necessary funding or addressing the need for comprehensive reform. Senators who opposed received a (+); those who voted in favor received a (-).

5. Dubai Ports: The proposed acquisition of London-based P&O Steam Navigation Company by the United Arab Emirates' Dubai Ports World (including the operation of six ports in the U.S.) resulted in an attack on an important U.S. ally and an unfortunate increase in anti-Arab rhetoric by government officials. Rather than promote much-needed reform in port security, several bills were introduced that instead focused on blocking the deal. Cosponsors of these bills—S. 2333 introduced by Senator **Chuck Schumer** (D-NY), S. 2334 introduced by Senator **Bob Menendez** (D-NJ), S.J. Res 32 introduced by Senator **Susan Collins** (R-ME) and S. 2341 introduced by Senator **Byron Dorgan** (D-ND)—received a (-).

6. Habeas Corpus: Before heading for recess, Congress voted on S. 3930, a long overdue bill to authorize military commissions for detainees in U.S. custody. Changes made just days before the vote removed the phrase “outside of the United States” from the section regarding habeas corpus—the means by which an individual can challenge their detention in a court of law. Although likely to be ruled unconstitutional by the Supreme Court, this new law would allow the federal government to indefinitely detain individuals—including green-card holders, students and other legal visitors—without allowing them to challenge their detention in court. Judiciary Committee Chairman **Arlen Specter** (R-PA) and Ranking Member **Patrick Leahy** (D-VT) sponsored an amendment to strike the section, with Specter saying, “I'm not going to support a bill that's blatantly unconstitutional ... that suspends a right that goes back to [the Magna Carta in] 1215.” The amendment failed 48-51. Senators who voted in favor of the amendment received a (+); those who opposed received a (-). In addition, concerns remain about other provisions of the bill, including the expanded definition of “enemy combatant.” Senators who opposed

the entire bill received a (+); those who voted in favor received (-).

7. Special Section:

a) Sponsored by Senator **Larry Craig** (R-ID), the SAFE Act (S.737) was introduced to amend sections of the Patriot Act to protect civil liberties. Cosponsors received a (+).

b) Senator **Chuck Hagel** (R-NE) deserved special recognition (+) for a series of thoughtful speeches on U.S. foreign policy in the Middle East and the war in Iraq.

c) Senators **Harry Reid** (D-NV), **Richard Durbin** (D-IL) and **Chuck Schumer** (D-NY) received a (-) for placing politics over policy. The three senators led a failed effort to disinvite Iraqi PM Nouri al-Maliki from addressing Congress because of comments in support of the Lebanese people during the war.

d) Senator **Lincoln Chafee** (R-RI) deserved special recognition (+) for his consistent advocacy for a Palestinian state and for being one of the first elected officials to call for a ceasefire in Lebanon.

e) Armed Services Chairman **John Warner** (R-VA) received special recognition (+) for speaking out during floor debate regarding the suffering of Palestinian and Lebanese civilians, stating, "I conclude our support for Israel is very strong, Mr. President, but it cannot be unconditional."

f) Although one of the senators who used the worst anti-Arab rhetoric during the Dubai Ports controversy, Senator **Frank Lautenberg** (D-NJ) received a (+) for apologizing for his remarks after meeting with New Jersey Arab Americans.

g) Senators **Richard Durbin** (D-IL), **Russ Feingold** (D-WI) and **Ted Kennedy** (D-MA) received a (+) for their continued commitment to ending the National Security Entry-Exit Registration Program (NSEERS), or "special registration," which continues to adversely affect thousands of Arabs in the U.S.

h) Senator **John E. Sununu** (R-NH) received a (+) for leading the Arab American congressional caucus in a successful meeting with Assistant Secretary of State David Welch urging the State Department to waive fees for American citizens evacuated from Lebanon.

i) Senators **John McCain** (R-AZ), **John Warner** (R-VA) and **Lindsay Graham** (R-SC) received a (+) for their leadership in the congressional debate on torture and detainee treatment.

1. Palestinian Aid: Introduced in the wake of the Palestinian legislative elections, H.R. 4681 called for severe restrictions on the ability of the U.S. to provide aid to non-governmental organizations (NGOs), attacks U.N. programs that benefit Palestinian civilians, and seeks to restrict PLO representation in Washington and New York. This legislation would do away with the President's ability to provide direct assistance if deemed in the national security interest of the U.S. and refuses to differentiate between groups that have renounced violence and entered into peace negotiations from those who have not. Further, the sanctions outlined in the bill do not include a sunset clause or any other mechanism to react to changing political realities. Congressmen who voted against the bill received a (+); those who voted in favor received a (-).

2. U.S. Engagement in the Middle East: Circulated in December 2005 by International Relations Committee Chairman **Henry Hyde** (R-IL) and Congresswoman **Lois Capps** (D-CA), the "Hyde-Capps" letter to Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice commends the Secretary on her engagement in securing the Palestinian-Israeli agreement on the Rafah border crossing. The letter urges the Secretary and President to make Palestinian-Israeli peace a personal commitment, stating, "more than three decades of Middle East peace efforts have shown that breakthroughs come only when the U.S. President or Secretary of State is personally involved." The 108 cosigners received a (+).

3. Lebanon Resolution: H. Res 921 was sponsored by Majority Leader **John Boehner** (R-OH) and introduced just six days after the start of the war. The uneven resolution included full support for Israel's actions, did not include a call for a ceasefire, did not urge Israel to protect civilian lives or infrastructure and made no mention of the thousands of Americans who found themselves in grave danger. Congressmen who voted against the bill received a (+); those who voted in favor received a (-).

4. Lebanon (Other): Several Congressmen received special recognition for their support of Lebanon.

- On September 14, Congressman **Ray LaHood** (R-IL) introduced H.R. 6082, a resolution to grant "temporary protected status" to Lebanese nationals in the U.S. because of the war in Lebanon. The eight cosponsors received a (+).

- On July 19, Congressman **Dennis Kucinich** (D-OH) introduced H.Con.Res. 450, a resolution calling on the President to appeal for a ceasefire and "commit United States diplomats to multi-party negotiations with no preconditions." The 34 cosponsors received a (+).

- On July 25, Congresswoman **Sheila Jackson-Lee** (D-TX) introduced H.Res. 945, a resolution calling for an immediate ceasefire and a humanitarian corridor "to alleviate the suffering of the people of Lebanon." The 18 cosponsors received a (+).

- On July 26, Congressman **James Leach** (R-IA) introduced H. Res. 954, a resolution urging the president to appoint a "Special Envoy for Middle East Peace." The four cosponsors receive a (+).

- Congressmen **Sam Farr** (D-CA) and **James McGovern** (D-MA) received a (+) for their introduction on July 26 of H. Res. 955, a resolution calling for U.S. assistance for reconstruction.

- Arab American Congressmen **Charles Boustany** (R-LA), **Darrell Issa** (R-CA), **Ray LaHood** (R-IL) and **Nick Rahall** (D-WV) received a (+) for working with Senator **John E. Sununu** (R-NH) to secure the fee waiver for American citizens evacuated from Lebanon.
- Congressman **Chris Van Hollen** (D-MD) received a (+) for his thoughtful letter to Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, writing, “You have failed the obligation of a good friend to give sound counsel and advice,” wrote Van Hollen. “...I strongly believe that a continuation of the bombing campaign...is against the interests of Israel and the United States.”
- Congresswoman **Marcy Kaptur** (D-OH) and 17 cosigners received a (+) for their letter to President Bush calling for an immediate ceasefire and U.S. engagement to find “successful long-term solutions.”
- Congressman **Nick Rahall** (D-WV) received a (+) for his letter to the Israeli Ambassador to the U.S. urging safe passage for humanitarian convoys in Lebanon.
- Congressmembers **Lois Capps** (D-CA), **David Price** (D-NC), **Bob Filner** (D-CA), and **James Leach** (R-IA) received a (+) for their letter to President Bush calling for a ceasefire, a multi-national force in southern Lebanon and the appointment of a U.S. special Middle East peace envoy.

5. Immigration: Introduced by Judiciary Committee Chairman **James Sensenbrenner** (R-WI), and passed on December 16, H.R. 4437, the “Border Protection, Antiterrorism, and Illegal Immigration Control Act of 2005” is one of the most sweeping anti-immigration measures passed in decades. Among the most egregious sections are provisions that would turn millions of undocumented immigrants into aggravated felons and levy harsh penalties including fines or imprisonment on those who aid them, while offering no solutions for our broken immigration system. Congressmen who voted against the bill received a (+); those who voted in favor received a (-). On September 14, the House voted on H.R. 6061, an enforcement-only bill to build a 700-mile fence along the U.S.-Mexico border without providing for the necessary funding or addressing the need for comprehensive reform of our broken immigration system. Congressmen who opposed received a (+); those who supported received a (-).

6. Civil Liberties: Introduced by Congressmen **Howard Berman** (D-CA) and **William Delahunt** (D-MA), H.R. 1502, the Civil Liberties Restoration Act is a bill that seeks to remedy some of the most egregious post-9/11 civil liberties violations facing Arab and Muslim immigrations, including secret immigration hearings and the “special registration” program. Cosponsors received a (+). Introduced by Congressman **Jerry Nadler** (D-NY), H.R. 2715, the SAFE Act, seeks to amend sections of the Patriot Act to protect civil liberties. Cosponsors received a (+).

7. Special Section:

- a) Congressmen **Jim Kolbe** (R-AZ) and **Jim Moran** (D-VA) received a (+) for their outspoken criticism of anti-Arab rhetoric surrounding the Dubai Ports World deal and for being the only members of the House Appropriations Committee to vote against an amendment to an emergency spending bill to block the deal. Congressman **Sherrod Brown** (D-OH), **Harold Ford** (D-TN) and **Peter King** (R-NY) received a (-) for placing politics before security in

their use of the controversy to gain headlines.

- b) Congressmembers **Ray LaHood** (R-IL), **Lois Capps** (D-CA), **Earl Blumenauer** (D-OR) and **David Price** (D-NC) received a (+) for leading the House opposition to H.R. 4681, including circulating a “dear colleague” letter opposing the bill.

- c) Congressman **Gary Ackerman** (D-NY) received a (-) for circulating a “dear colleague” letter urging support for H.R. 4681 because of Israel’s strong support for the bill.

- d) Congressman **Joe Knollenberg** (R-MI) received a (-) for his letter to President George W. Bush urging the president to halt all U.S. assistance to the Palestinian Authority and reevaluate U.S. assistance to the Palestinian people.

- e) Congressman **Anthony Weiner** (D-NY) received a (-) for consistently introducing legislation aimed at harming Palestinian moderates, including cutting all aid to the Palestinian people and closing the PLO office in Washington, D.C.

- f) International Relations Committee Ranking Member **Tom Lantos** (D-CA) received a (-) for placing a temporary hold on humanitarian assistance for Lebanon after the war.

- g) Although the bill was not introduced, Congressmen **Joseph Crowley** (D-NY) and **Michael McCaul** (R-TX) received a (-) for circulating an irresponsible and inaccurate bill mischaracterizing the plight of Palestinian Christians. Conversely, retiring International Relations Committee Chairman **Henry Hyde** (R-IL) received a (+) for providing a forum for Palestinians to testify on the daily humiliation of the occupation.

- h) Retiring Congressman **Jim Kolbe** (R-AZ) received a (+) for his fair and thoughtful tenure as Chairman of the Appropriations Committee’s Foreign Operations Subcommittee as well as a “dear colleague” letter signed by six colleagues opposing cuts in aid to Egypt.

- i) Minority Leader **Nancy Pelosi** (D-CA) and Congressman **Rahm Emanuel** (D-IL) received a (-) for placing politics over policy, leading a failed effort to disinvite Iraqi PM Nouri al-Maliki from addressing Congress because of comments in support of the Lebanese people during the war.
